
You are about to embark on a scenic journey unlike any in the world.



1. Explore Tahoe Visitor Center

In the Heavenly Village. Interactive displays, and visitor information.

2. Heavenly Village

Shops, restaurants, and the Heavenly Gondola

3. Camp Richardson/ Tallac Historic Sites

Miles of alpine beaches, restaurants, horseback riding and bike rentals. Historic mansions (summer tours).

4. Taylor Creek Visitor Center USDA Forest Service

Nature trails, ecology information, stream profile chamber along Taylor Creek.

5. Emerald Bay Lookout

Spectacular location overlooking Emerald Bay, one of the most photographed places in the world. Trail to Vikingsholm Castle (summer tours).

6. D.L. Bliss State Park

Secluded beach and picnic area with views of Rubicon Bay.

7. Meeks Bay

Former home of the Washoe Indians. Beach and campground.

8. Sugar Pine Point State Park

Location of historic Queen Anne-style Ehrman Mansion (summer tours), General Phipps Cabin, picnic grounds, hiking and bike trails.

9. Tahoe Maritime Museum

A vast collection of photos and boating memorabilia that dates back to the 19th century.

10. Tahoe City/Gatekeepers Museum/Fanny Bridge

Marion Steinbach Indian Basket Collection. Logging and railroad history, and views of huge trout from Fanny Bridge.

11. Squaw Valley USA

Site of 1960 Winter Olympics, skiing, tram, swimming, ice-skating, bungee jumping, lodging, Olympic Museum and restaurants.

12. Tahoe City Visitor Center

Our resident information specialists will guide you in getting the most from you North Lake Tahoe visit.

13. Watson Cabin

Historic cabin with 1900-era furnishings, located in the center of Tahoe City.

14. Kings Beach

Beach, pier, water craft rentals, dining and shops.

15. Crystal Bay

Site of many north shore casinos and the entertainment hub of North Lake Tahoe.

16. Stateline Lookout

Hiking trail to stunning views of Lake Tahoe.

17. Mt. Rose Lookout

View of Lake Tahoe and Diamond Peak.

18. Incline Village/Crystal Bay Visitors Center

Local experts plus maps, gift items, Ponderosa Ranch and Washoe Indian exhibits. Thunderbird Lodge Tours (summer only).

19. Tahoe Center for Environmental Sciences

Open to the public, hands on and virtual exhibits.

20. Hwy 28 Shared Use Path

A three mile shared-use path from the southern end of Incline Village to Sand Harbor State Park.

21. Sand Harbor

Spectacular sandy beach, outdoor amphitheater (home of the Lake Tahoe Shakespeare Festival), picnic area, restaurant and State Park Information Center. Fee to enter.

22. Spooner Lake

Lake loop trail and other hiking trails, picnic areas.

23. Cave Rock Vista Point

Sacred site of the native Washoe Indians also a short climb to the top where great views await.

24. Zephyr Cove Resort

Lodge, restaurant, beach, park, paddleboat cruises, RV park, horseback riding and sailing cruises.

25. Tahoe South Visitor Center

One-stop shop for friendly suggestions, maps, and nearby points of interest.
